

As a Youth & Community Worker, you will work with our project teams to deliver drop-in sessions, one-to-one mentoring, school-based support, and community projects, providing guidance on education, employment, health, and personal development. You'll work closely with young people to help them set goals, overcome challenges, and connect them with the right support networks. Your focus will be on helping young people develop confidence, skills, and the ability to make informed choices about their future.

Your work will involve building strong relationships with local organisations, parents, and support agencies, ensuring young people have access to the right resources. You'll also play a role in organising community projects to ensure the voices of young people are heard.

Key responsibilities

- Plan and deliver youth and community sessions, including drop-ins, one-to-ones, and group activities, with some late evenings and weekend sessions where required to meet the needs of the community.
- Support and mentor young people to build confidence, develop skills, and set and achieve personal goals.
- Facilitate activities that help young people make informed choices about their education, health, and future.
- Empower young people to take an active role in shaping their lives, connecting them with additional support where needed.
- Build relationships with schools, parents, and local organisations to support and promote youth programmes.
- Ensure all sessions are safe, inclusive, and compliant with safeguarding and health and safety standards.
- Maintain accurate records to track young people's progress and evaluate programme outcomes.

In this role, you'll help keep impact at the front and centre of all our projects. You'll gather insights and create case studies that show the real difference we make for young people. Your work will bring our mission to life and highlight the impact of what we do.

- Information, Advice, and Guidance (IAG) Level 2 Certificate or above.
- A good standard of education, including GCSEs (grade A-C in English).
- Presentation and teaching skills.
