Title: Senior Youth & Community Practitioner

Key responsibilities:

- **Deliver youth and community work sessions (e.g., drop-ins, mobile work, 1-to-1s, assemblies), including our holiday club programmes. Our commitment to youth voice throughout our programmes means this role will include evening work and possible weekends.**
- **Provide individual mentoring and support in schools and community settings, helping young people set and work towards appropriate goals.**
- **Support young people's social, emotional, physical, and educational development, building their skills, confidence, and decision-making abilities.**
- **Empower and signpost young people through one-to-one and group work, helping them overcome challenges and access additional support.**
- **Plan and take part in community projects and programmes that enable young people to express themselves, raise concerns, and explore future options.**
- **Champion youth voice, ensuring young people influence decision-making, programme delivery, and opportunities for leadership.**
- **Build and maintain strong local networks, acting as a key point of contact for young people, families, partners, and community organisations.**
- **Ensure safe, high-quality delivery, including managing behaviour, maintaining resources, recording data, supervising staff/volunteers, and following safeguarding, health & safety, and data protection guidelines.**
