At Inspire, we are looking for Employment & Skills Coaches to join Inspire's Youth Employment Service (Thrive) team, supporting young people aged 16–24 who are not currently in education, employment or training. These are young people who are often furthest from being EET-ready, and Thrive Coaches work intensively with them to build confidence, develop key skills, and support their progression into employment, education, or training.

# Key responsibilities

## **1. Diverse youth support**

Work with young people with diverse needs to support them into education, employment or training, tailoring assistance to address individual challenges and aspirations.

## **2. Caseload management**

Efficiently manage a caseload of young participants, ensuring 100% engagement and progression and track progress through data entry via the VIEWS CRM system.

## **3. Delivering guidance**

Deliver impartial Information, Advice, and Guidance (IAG), offering support in crafting CVs, navigating job searches, and preparing for interviews.

## **4. Workshop delivery and engagement**

Conduct 1-2-1 and group workshops, emphasising employability skills, job search techniques, and consistent engagement with a caseload.

## **5. Vacancy matching**

Screen and match candidates with local job and training opportunities, as well as recruiting for internal programmes.

## **6. Rural engagement**

Find innovative methods to connect with rural youth who face transport challenges, ensuring accessibility to our services beyond the main hub.

## **7. Outcome-driven performance**

Proactively achieve KPIs, targeting 55% of young people placed into employment and 25% progressing to further training or education.

## **8. Stakeholder relationship management**

Serve as the primary point of contact for local youth, referral partners, and parents/guardians, fostering strong community relationships.

## **9. Labour market monitoring and expertise**

Actively engage with external partners and local employers to maintain current and relevant Labour Market Information (LMI).

## **Essential:**

- Proven experience delivering Information, Advice, and Guidance (IAG).
- Previous experience of outward-bound or direct delivery youth work, outreach or equivalent.

- Enhanced DBS Certificate (this is essential as part of the role and can be undertaken if not already held).

- Proven experience of supporting disadvantaged young people (NEET) into sustainable outcomes.

- Proven experience engaging and supporting neuro-divergent young people.
- Information, Advice, and Guidance (IAG) Level 4 or above.

- Good organisational skills and ability to work to deadlines.
